Print out a picture of the fox and one of the crow, enlarge them, and post them on the board. Say or sign a statement from the list below. Let the students decide if the phrase belongs with the fox or the crow, and write it under the appropriate character.

An alternate version of this activity requires more reading: write the phrases on strips, without the word "Who" ("...really wanted to get a piece of cheese," for example), and have the students take turns reading each phrase and decide which character it belongs to. If you like, add more questions of your own.
